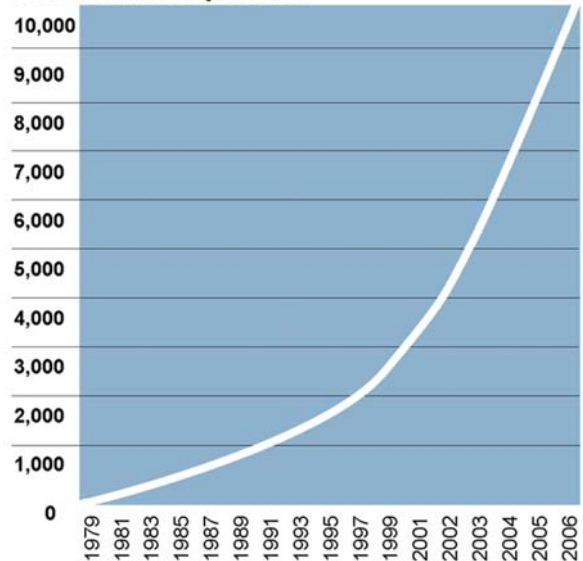
ACCP Membership Demographics

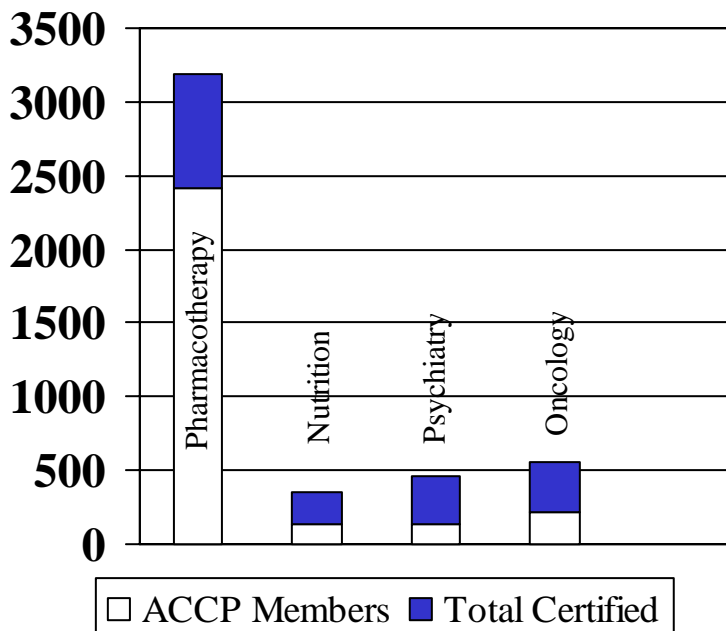
Education and Training

ACCP members are highly trained pharmacy professionals who are experts in the field of pharmacotherapy and influential in drug therapy decision making. Eighty-five percent of ACCP members hold a Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) degree. Over 75% of these members have completed additional residency or fellowship training.

Board Certification

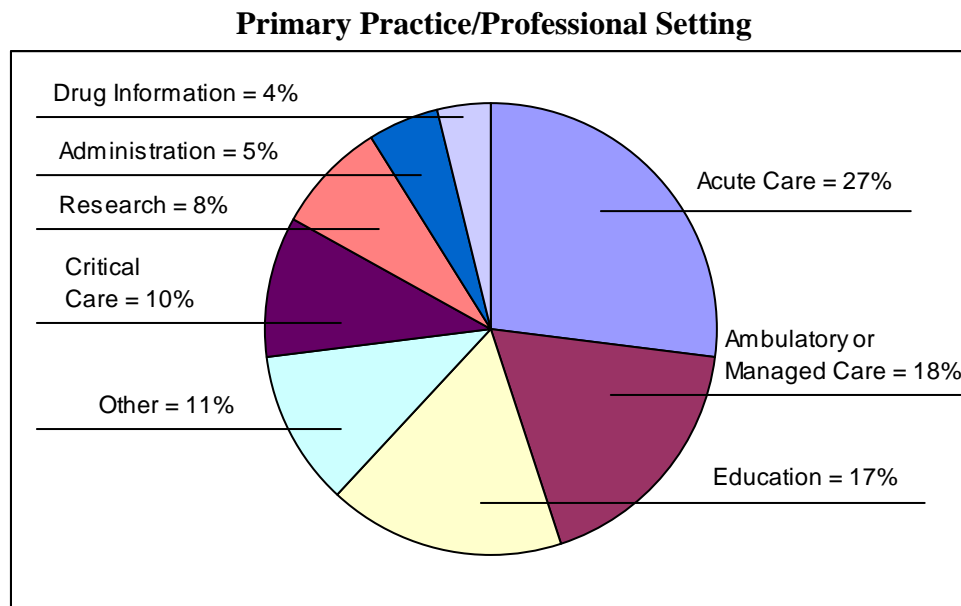


Many ACCP members hold board certification in one or more sub-specialty areas of clinical pharmacy. ACCP supports the continuing education-based recertification program for Board Certified Pharmacotherapy Specialists (BCPS) and Board Certified Oncology Pharmacists (BCOP).

Where Do ACCP Members Practice?

Today, clinical pharmacists work in virtually every health care practice setting. The majority of ACCP members are employed in hospitals, health care systems, or academic institutions. The primary professional position they report most frequently is clinical pharmacist followed by assistant professor, pharmacy manager/supervisor, and clinical coordinator.

How Are ACCP Members Involved in Drug Therapy Decision Making?

- 43% of ACCP members serve on a Pharmacy and Therapeutics or Formulary Committee.
- 84% are consulted by physicians and other health professionals on the choice of therapeutic agents for their patients. Two-thirds of these members provide this consultation on a daily basis.
- 86% of ACCP members have provided inservice programs or other forms of clinical education to health care providers outside pharmacy.
