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Brent N. Reed, Pharm.D., BCPS-AQ Cardiology, FAHA, is an Associate Professor at the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy and a clinical pharmacy specialist at the University of Maryland Medical Center in Baltimore, Maryland, where he practices in advanced heart failure. He also serves as program director for the Postgraduate Year 2 Cardiology Pharmacy Residency Program at the University of Maryland. Dr. Reed received his Bachelor of Science in Biology from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville, Tennessee, and Doctor of Pharmacy from the University of Tennessee College of Pharmacy in Memphis, Tennessee. Subsequently he completed a pharmacy practice residency and cardiology specialty residency at the University of North Carolina Hospitals in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. He is a board-certified pharmacotherapy specialist with added qualifications in cardiology.

Dr. Reed's primary academic interest is advanced heart failure, and his scholarly contributions include over 30 peer-reviewed publications and 5 book chapters, as well as nearly 70 research and professional presentations. In 2015, he co-founded the Applied Therapeutics, Research, and Instruction at the University of Maryland (ATRIUM) collaborative, which focuses on the advancement of care provided to patients with cardiovascular disease. His other professional interest is work psychology, and his interests in performance and motivation led him to pursue a master's degree in applied psychology (industrial/organizational psychology) at the University of Baltimore starting in 2017.

Dr. Reed has been active in professional organizations at the local, state, and national levels. He is a former Trustee of the American Pharmacists Association (APhA) and former National President of the APhA Academy of Student Pharmacists, and he is currently a fellow of the American Heart Association. In 2014, he was the recipient of the APhA Outstanding New Practitioner Award and in 2015 received the American College of Clinical Pharmacy's New Educator Award.
