Jones, Pastakia, Zillich to Receive ACCP Honors

ACCP members Mikael Jones, Pharm.D., BCPS; Sonak Pastakia, Pharm.D., MPH, BCPS; and Alan Zillich, Pharm.D., were selected by the 2009 ACCP Awards Committee to receive the College's prestigious 2010 New Educator, New Clinical Practitioner, and New Investigator Awards, respectively. The awards will be presented in Charlotte, North Carolina, on Saturday, April 24, 2010, during the Opening General Session of the 2010 Spring Practice and Research Forum.

The ACCP New Educator Award is given to recognize and honor a new educator for outstanding contributions to the discipline of teaching and to the education of health care practitioners. The awardee must have been a Full Member of ACCP at the time of nomination and a member at any level for a minimum of 3 years; in addition, the awardee must have completed his/her terminal training or degree less than 6 years previously. Mikael D. Jones, Pharm.D., BCPS, is Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Pharmacy Practice and Science at the University of Kentucky College of Pharmacy. He also has an appointment as Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Kentucky College of Nursing and is a volunteer faculty member in the Center for Advancement of Women's Health. Dr. Jones is actively involved in the clinical education of students in the schools of pharmacy and nursing, where he coordinates and teaches pharmacotherapy and physical assessment courses. He also serves as a clinical preceptor for pharmacy students and pharmacy residents. He is recognized as a gifted young instructor. In particular, his work in updating and streamlining the college of pharmacy's physical assessment curriculum has led to an innovative, competency-based system of learning. A colleague commented in her letter of support, "Dr. Jones' primary concern has been student learning.... For an individual so early in his career, he has accomplished a great deal and affected the learning of many students." Another colleague adds,

He understands the principles of "good" teaching. Dr. Jones does the little things that translate into tangible



outcomes in the classroom, such as having an open-door policy, grading assignments in a critical but timely fashion, and participating in student-sponsored activities.

In recognition of his support of student activities, Dr. Jones was elected to honorary membership in Phi Lambda Sigma by University of Kentucky students.

The New Clinical Practitioner Award honors a new clinical practitioner who has made outstanding contributions to the health of patients and/or the practice of clinical pharmacy.

The awardee must have been a Full Member of ACCP at the time of nomination, as well as a member at any level for a minimum of 3 years; in addition, the awardee must have completed his/her terminal training or degree less than 6 years previously. Sonak D. Pastakia, Pharm.D., MPH, BCPS, is Assistant Professor of Pharmacy Practice for the Purdue University School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences. He is the full-time Purdue School of Pharmacy faculty member in Eldoret, Kenya, as part of a collaboration between Indiana University School of Medicine and the Moi University School of Medicine in Kenya. This partnership has focused on the identification and treatment of individuals with HIV. One nominator wrote in his letter of support for Dr. Pastakia's nomination,



As a clinical pharmacy practitioner, Sonak facilitates the provision of inpatient and ambulatory care pharmacy services in a tremendously resource-poor environment. Sonak's patient base includes 3000 patients for which he has primary responsibility and an additional 16,000 [patients] that he assists through the establishment of a distribution network allowing access to antiretroviral therapies and other supportive care. Sonak's presence in Eldoret has enabled the collaboration to expand its provision of care through enhanced access to pharmaceuticals as well as the provision of clinical pharmacy support.

Dr. Pastakia is a practitioner in both inpatient and ambulatory care settings, where he precepts four to six pharmacy students every 8 weeks. "It is important to note that Sonak has successfully launched a clinical pharmacy

practice in an area where there was no pre-existing model,” adds one of his nominators. His work has enabled the expansion of pharmacy-based services, including a recently implemented anticoagulation program.

The New Investigator Award recognizes an ACCP member who has made a significant impact on an aspect of clinical pharmaceutical science. The awardee must have been a member of ACCP for more than 3 years; must have completed his/her terminal training or degree less than 6



years previously; and must have a research program with a substantial publication record having a programmatic theme or an especially noteworthy single publication. Alan J. Zillich, Pharm.D., is Assistant Professor of Pharmacy Practice at Purdue University School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences. Dr. Zillich’s research theme is care of the ambulatory patient with a focus on hypertension, smoking cessation, and practice standards. At the time of his nomination, he had published 31 peer-reviewed research manuscripts and received numerous competitive research awards, including a Veterans Affairs Career Development Award on which he was principal investigator. One of his nominators noted,

I have had the opportunity to work [with] and mentor many colleagues. I can say, without a doubt, that Alan is the most outstanding junior faculty member with whom I have worked.... [Dr. Zillich] 1) has the necessary ingredients for a successful, independent research career, 2) produces quality work and is reliable in his commitments to collaborators, and 3) exhibits an outstanding level of productivity.

Dr. Zillich will deliver the annual New Investigator Award Lecture at 6:00 p.m. during the April 24 Opening General Session in Charlotte.

PRNs Provide Focused Education and Networking in Charlotte

ACCP’s Practice and Research Networks provide tailored education and networking opportunities in a variety of therapeutic and non-therapeutic areas of interest. At the 2010 Spring Practice and Research Forum and Updates in Therapeutics: The Pharmacotherapy Preparatory Course, the PRNs will present the focus sessions they developed, designed to meet the needs expressed by PRN members.

Focus sessions begin on Saturday morning, with the Women’s Health PRN looking at several ongoing concerns and treatment options in a variety of women’s

health topics, including mental health issues in peri- and postmenopausal years, sex disparities in hypertension, and hormone replacement therapy and non-hormonal therapy for menopausal management. Sunday afternoon, the Adult Medicine PRN will review the evidence for antithrombotic controversies in medicine. Faculty will discuss the pharmacotherapeutic management of patients receiving proton pump inhibitors and clopidogrel and the cardiovascular risks associated with the CYP interaction between omeprazole and clopidogrel, as well as antithrombotic therapy for patients with heart failure.

The Drug Information PRN focus session on Tuesday morning will look at the changing role of direct-to-consumer (DTC) advertising and counter-detailing. Recent changes in the PhRMA guidelines and the ways in which they affect DTC advertising, as well as future DTC advertising applications, will be discussed. Faculty will review the evidence on the effectiveness of counter-detailing and ways to develop an effective counter-detailing program. Later Tuesday morning, the Infectious Diseases PRN and the Clinical Administration PRN will jointly present a program on antimicrobial stewardship programs, including how to establish best practices within such programs. From the justification of a stewardship program to the metrics involved in measuring its success, faculty will provide participants with resources to implement a successful antimicrobial stewardship program. The final focus session on Tuesday will be presented by members of the Ambulatory Care PRN and the Nephrology PRN.

This session will delve into new developments in vitamin D therapy, including deficiency and supplementation, and its role in the treatment of various disease states, such as chronic kidney disease. Faculty will also explore the emerging role of vitamin D in ambulatory care practice, including treatment of cardiovascular disease, cancer, osteoporosis, and psoriasis.

PRNs will host these reception-style events Saturday afternoon, Sunday evening, and Monday afternoon. Final Award and FCCP Nominations Period Closes February 15

Nominations for the awards and honors listed below are **due February 15, 2010**. Additional information on award criteria may be obtained from ACCP headquarters. All nomination materials, including letters, vitae or resumes, and other supporting documents, can be submitted online to ACCP. The online nominations portal specifies the nominating materials required for each award or honor. This portal is available at <http://www.accp.com/membership/nominations.aspx>.

2010 ACCP Fellows: Fellowship is awarded in recognition of continued excellence in clinical pharmacy practice or research. Nominees must have been Full Members of ACCP for at least 5 years, must have been in practice for at least 10 years since receipt of their highest professional pharmacy degree, and must have made a sustained contribution to ACCP through activities such as presentation at College meetings; service to ACCP committees, PRNs, chapters, or publications; or election as an officer. Candidates must be nominated by any two Full Members other than the nominee, by any Fellow, or by any member of the Board of Regents. Current members of the Board of Regents and the Credentials: FCCP Committee are ineligible for consideration. **Nomination deadline: February 15, 2010.**

2010 Paul F. Parker Medal for Distinguished Service to the Profession of Pharmacy: Recognizes an individual who has made outstanding and sustained contributions to improving or expanding the profession of pharmacy in an area of professional service, including but not limited to patient care, leadership, administration, financial, technological, information processing, service delivery, models of care, and advocacy. The award is not limited to pharmacists or ACCP members. All nominations must consist of a letter to the Chair of the Selection Committee detailing the nominee's qualifications for this award and his/her contributions to the profession of pharmacy; the nominee's curriculum vitae, resume, or biographical sketch as available; and a minimum of three letters of recommendation. At least one of these letters must be from an individual outside the nominee's current practice locale. Current members of the Board of Regents, Research Institute Board of Trustees, *Pharmacotherapy* Board of Directors, Selection Committee, or ACCP staff are ineligible. **Nomination deadline: February 15, 2010.**

New Clinical Practitioner Award This award is scheduled to be given during ACCP's 2011 Annual Meeting in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Its purpose is to recognize and honor a new clinical practitioner who has made outstanding contributions to the health of patients and/or the practice of clinical pharmacy. Nominees must be Full Members of ACCP at the time of nomination and a member at any level for a minimum of 3 years. In addition, nominees must have completed their terminal pharmacy training or degree (whichever is most recent) within the past 6 years. Fellows of ACCP (i.e., "FCCP") are not eligible. All nominations must

include: 1) a letter of nomination from an ACCP member detailing the nominee's qualifications for the award; 2) the nominee's curriculum vitae; and 3) letters of support from two other ACCP members describing the individual's accomplishments relative to the award criteria. At least one of the required letters of support must be from an individual outside the nominee's current place of employment. Additional letters of support also may be included. Self nomination is not permitted and current members of the Board of Regents, Awards Committee, or ACCP staff are ineligible. **Nomination deadline: February 15, 2010.**

Fellows of ACCP (i.e., "FCCP") are not eligible. All nominations must include: 1) a letter of nomination from an ACCP member detailing the nominee's qualifications for the award; 2) the nominee's curriculum vitae; and 3) letters of support from two other ACCP members describing the individual's accomplishments relative to the award criteria. At least one of the required letters of support must be from an individual outside the nominee's current place of employment. Additional letters of support also may be included. ACCP's Popular Online CV Review Service Now Open to Postgraduate Trainees

Beginning in January, ACCP's innovative Online Curriculum Vitae Review Service is accepting submissions from its postgraduate trainee members. This program, now in its third year and previously available only to ACCP student members, is an exclusive service for student, resident, and fellow members of ACCP as a means to facilitate their curriculum vitae (CV) preparation.



As the clinical pharmacy profession continues to experience an increase in demand and competition for residency positions and first-rate jobs, it is vital that students and postgraduate trainees have a well-written CV. An effective CV provides a positive image for future selection committees or employers, and it distinguishes an individual from the rest of the crowd. As questions arise in preparing and completing a CV, wouldn't it be helpful to have a seasoned professional review it?

Now through the beginning of April, student, resident, and fellow members may submit their CVs online as a Microsoft Word document and have it randomly assigned to a volunteer ACCP member reviewer. The ACCP reviewer will provide his/her comments and suggested edits using the track changes feature in Microsoft Word. Participants will receive an e-mail containing feedback from the reviewer within 2 weeks.

When preparing a CV for review, be sure to take advantage of ACCP's other Web-based resources. Learn or review the basics of CV formatting, view sample CVs, and access valuable "curriculum vitae pearls," which provide practical insights in developing a CV. ACCP Governance and Leadership

In 2009, at the request of President Murphy, ACCP conducted a survey addressing issues related to organizational governance. The results provided ACCP with ideas on how to better inform members regarding ACCP's governance system and processes and on ways in which ACCP can better involve its members in organizational activities. One of the issues raised in the survey responses was the perception that ACCP leadership is sometimes not entirely representative of its members. In particular, survey responses noted that a substantial proportion of the ACCP membership is composed of



practitioners who do not have primary faculty appointments, whereas the composition of the Board of Regents (BOR) is often predominantly individuals from academia. ACCP would benefit from efforts to expand the field of members considered for election to the BOR. To address these issues, I have appointed a special task force on governance, which Dr. Lynn Crismon from the University of Texas will chair. This task force is charged with developing a report providing recommendations on how ACCP can expand the field of members considered for election to the BOR. In particular, this task force is asked to provide recommendations on how ACCP can expand the field of practitioners and other members without primary academic appointments who are interested and willing to be considered for elected office. The task force is operating with an aggressive timeline, and I look forward to receiving its recommendations this summer.

I am sometimes asked by members how one can “move up the ladder” to be considered for the ballot for election to the BOR. Nominations of individuals for consideration for the BOR can be made by any ACCP member, and all ACCP committees are charged annually with providing nominations for consideration for the BOR. The Nominations Committee then develops the election slate on the basis of nominee qualifications, particularly the volume and quality of previous service to ACCP, as well as balance with respect to geography, gender, and numerous other considerations.

How can you prepare yourself for leadership within ACCP? Before appearing on a ballot, most current and past BOR members were members of one or more committees, eventually becoming vice-chair and then chair of an ACCP committee. Committee service and chairmanship is a common pathway to leadership within ACCP. All ACCP members are encouraged to respond to the request for committee service survey that is distributed every August. When responding to the survey, don't simply list your name and indicate the committee(s) for which you would like to be considered; provide some text in the comments section on why you are interested in service on specific committees, and list the attributes you would bring to achieving that committee's charges. Once appointed to a committee, be sure to actively participate and work hard toward completion of the committee's charges. Each year, the BOR asks committee chairs and vice-chairs for the names of committee members who worked particularly hard and contributed substantially to the committee's activities; these individuals are usually selected to be committee chairs and vice-chairs in subsequent years. Committee service and committee leadership are excellent paths toward potential consideration for election to the BOR.

Other pathways to ACCP leadership are available, particularly through service as an officer of a Practice and Research Network (PRN), chapter, or ad hoc task force. I encourage you to run for office in your PRN or chapter. These types of leadership activities provide excellent experience and visibility that may translate into subsequent opportunities for more advanced leadership within the organization.

Some of you may ask, “Why would I want to be a member of the BOR or in other leadership positions within ACCP?” For me, there are numerous answers to that question. One answer: to give something back to the profession that has so greatly rewarded me professionally and personally. Another answer and reason for holding membership and leadership positions is the opportunity to contribute to the advancement of clinical pharmacy and the profession overall. Leadership within ACCP provides the

opportunity to be at the table with the leaders of pharmacy, advocate for practice changes that advance the profession, and participate in the professional growth of ACCP members. Leadership activities within ACCP are tremendously rewarding.

If you are not already doing so, I encourage you to become actively involved in a committee, a task force, a PRN, or a chapter. Please consider pursuing leadership roles in one or more of those groups. The continued success of ACCP and the continued advancement of clinical pharmacy depend on developing our members for leadership within the organization and the profession. We need you. 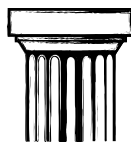

The School of Pharmacy at USF Health College of Medicine invites applications and nominations to fill two newly created Associate Dean positions. The Associate Dean for Academic and Clinical Affairs will provide leadership in developing and implementing the USF School of Pharmacy within the USF system as part of a system campus. The Associate Dean for Faculty Affairs will provide leadership in developing and implementing faculty recruitment, relations, and development for the USF School of Pharmacy. Both Associate Deans will report directly to the Dean of the School of Pharmacy and will be major contributors to the senior management team of this newly developing school as it prepares for provisional accreditation. The Associate Deans will assist in pre-candidate application activities for review by ACPE and will help with infrastructure development for the USF School of Pharmacy.

Minimum qualifications include an earned doctorate in a pharmacy-related instructional or research discipline, with qualifications and accomplishments sufficient to qualify for appointment at the rank of Associate Professor/Professor with a concurrent tenure-accruing appointment in an academic department of the School. A minimum of 5 years' experience as a faculty member in an academic setting, together with a strong history of teaching, scholarly, and professional achievement, is required. Appointment at the rank of Associate Professor/Professor typically requires 5 years of continuous and productive service at the rank of Assistant/Associate Professor. If a candidate holds a Pharm.D. degree, he/she must have or be eligible for Florida Licensure.

Preferred qualifications include:

- Significant administrative experience and responsibility in the dean's office of an ACPE-accredited college with demonstrated commitment to excellence and innovation
- Excellent interpersonal skills, superior oral and written communication skills, and flexibility in responding to the changing demands of academic health centers
