Opportunities for 2018 Recertification Credit

There is still time to earn recertification credit before the end of the year. ACCP registers recertification credits with the Board of Pharmacy Specialties (BPS) **as of the date of test submission**. This means that any posttests successfully submitted before midnight (CST) on December 31 will earn 2018 credits.

ACCP has several products currently available for board specialty recertification credit. Many of these products will be available for recertification credit through the first quarter of 2019. "New and improved" summarizes much of 2018 for Pharmacotherapy Publications, Inc. (PPI), the corporate journal-publishing unit affiliated with ACCP. The "new" second official journal of ACCP, the Journal of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy (JACCP), published its first issue in October 2018. Editor-in-Chief Jerry L. Bauman and Associate Editors Robert B. Parker, Beth Bryles Phillips, and Alan J. Zillich assembled a 26-member editorial board and produced two issues of JACCP in 2018, publishing papers across the spectrum of clinical pharmacy practice. Watch for six issues filled with highquality research, insightful reviews, and compelling editorials in 2019.

The "improved" impact factor of ACCP's first official journal, *Pharmacotherapy*, was announced in the summer of 2018. The impact factor is a vital measure in biomedical publishing of a journal's impact on its field, and *Pharmacotherapy's* current impact factor of 3.196 is the highest in the journal's history. Editor-in-Chief C. Lindsay DeVane, the 10-member scientific editorial council, and the 47-member editorial board continue to invite and select the highest-quality papers in the field of pharmacology and drug therapy. These PPI editors, board members, and staff look forward to continuing to serve *Pharmacotherapy's* readers and authors in 2019 with an online-only publication. ACCP members will continue to receive full-text access to both *Pharmacotherapy* and *JACCP* electronically.

Moreover, although all PPI directors, editors, and staff are pleased to reflect on everything that was "new and improved" in 2018, their focus is on the future. Advancement and dissemination of scholarship in pharmacotherapy and clinical pharmacy worldwide will remain a top priority for all such personnel. They will continue to deliver value to authors, readers, and reviewers by sponsoring live programming focused on scholar development; publishing regular podcasts; disseminating research and resources through social media outlets; and exploring new publications and services.

Call for Nominations

Due February 15, 2019 – <u>Nominations</u> for the 2019 Parker Medal, the 2019 "new" awards (New Investigator, New Clinical Practitioner, and New Educator), and the 2019 ACCP Fellows (FCCPs) must be uploaded to the nominations portal.

Due April 1, 2019 – Nominees' supporting documents must be uploaded to the nominations portal for the 2019 "new" awards (New Investigator, New Clinical Practitioner, and New Educator).

DESCRIPTIONS:

2019 ACCP Fellows: Fellowship is awarded in recognition of continued excellence in clinical pharmacy practice or research. Nominees must have been Full Members of ACCP for at least 5 years, must have been in practice for at least 10 years since receipt of their highest professional pharmacy degree, and must have made a sustained contribution to ACCP through activities such as presentation at College meetings; service to ACCP committees, PRNs, chapters, or publications; or election as an officer. Candidates must be nominated by any two Full Members other than the nominee, by any Fellow, or by any member of the ACCP Board of Regents. Current members of the ACCP Board of Regents, ACCP Foundation Board of Trustees, Pharmacotherapy Publications, Inc. (PPI) Board of Directors, ACCP Credentials: FCCP Committee, or ACCP staff are ineligible for consideration. Nomination deadline: February 15, 2019.

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2019 Paul F. Parker Medal for Distinguished Service to the Profession of Pharmacy: This award recognizes an individual who has made outstanding and sustained contributions to improving or expanding the profession of pharmacy in an area of professional service – including, but not limited to, patient care, leadership, administration, finance, technology, information processing, service delivery, models of care, and advocacy. The award is not limited to pharmacists or ACCP members. Nominations must consist of a letter detailing the nominee's qualifications for this award and his or her contributions to the profession of pharmacy; the nominee's curriculum vitae, resume, or biographical sketch as available; and a minimum of three letters of recommendation. At least one of these letters must be from an individual outside the nominee's current practice locale. Current members of the ACCP Board of Regents, ACCP Foundation Board of Trustees, PPI Board of Directors, ACCP Parker Medal Selection Committee, or ACCP staff are ineligible. Nomination deadline: February 15, 2019.

2019 New Investigator Award: This award highlights the research program of a new investigator who has made a major impact on an aspect of clinical pharmaceutical science. Nominees must have been a Full Member of ACCP at the time of nomination and a member at any level for at least 3 years; they must have a research program with a significant publication record having a programmatic theme or an especially noteworthy single publication; and it must have been within 6 years since completion of their terminal professional pharmacy training or degree, whichever is most recent. If an individual pursues an additional degree beyond his or her professional pharmacy degree or training (i.e., Ph.D.), this additional degree will not be considered a terminal degree, and the 6-year time interval will extend from completion of the terminal pharmacy training or degree. Nominations will consist of a letter from an ACCP member to the chair of the Awards Committee detailing the nominee's gualifications for this award and the significance/impact of his or her research program, the nominee's curriculum vitae, and a minimum of two letters of recommendation from other ACCP members. At least one of these letters must be from an individual outside

the nominee's current institute of practice. Selfnominations are not permitted. Current members of the ACCP Board of Regents, ACCP Foundation Board of Trustees, PPI Board of Directors, ACCP Awards Committee, or ACCP staff are ineligible. **Nomination deadline: February 15, 2019.**

2019 New Clinical Practitioner Award: This award recognizes a new clinical practitioner who has made outstanding contributions to the health of patients and/or the practice of clinical pharmacy. Nominees must have been Full Members of ACCP at the time of nomination and members at any level for at least 3 years. In addition, nominees must have completed their terminal professional pharmacy training or degree (whichever is most recent) within 6 years from the time of selection by the Board of Regents. If an individual pursues an additional degree beyond his or her professional pharmacy degree or training (i.e., Ph.D.), this additional degree will not be considered a terminal degree, and the 6-year time interval will extend from completion of the terminal pharmacy training or degree. Fellows of ACCP (i.e., "FCCPs") are ineligible. Nominations will consist of a letter from an ACCP member to the chair of the Awards Committee detailing the nominee's qualifications for this award and the significance/impact of his or her clinical contributions, the nominee's curriculum vitae, and a minimum of two letters of recommendation from other ACCP members. At least one of these letters must be from an individual outside the nominee's current institute of practice. Self-nominations are not permitted. Current members of the ACCP Board of Regents, ACCP Foundation Board of Trustees, PPI Board of Directors, ACCP Awards Committee, or ACCP staff are ineligible. Nomination deadline: February 15, 2019.

2019 New Educator Award: This award recognizes and honors a new educator for outstanding contributions to the discipline of teaching and to the education of health care practitioners. Nominees must have been Full Members of ACCP at the time of nomination and members at any level for at least 3 years. In addition, nominees must have completed their terminal professional pharmacy training or degree (whichever is most recent) within 6 years from the time of selection by the Board of Regents. If an individual pursues an additional degree beyond his or her professional pharmacy degree or training (i.e., Ph.D.), this additional degree will not be considered a terminal degree, and the 6-year time interval will extend from completion of the terminal pharmacy training or degree. Fellows of ACCP (i.e., "FCCPs") are ineligible. Nominations will con-sist of a letter from an ACCP member to the chair of the Awards Committee detailing the nominee's qualifications for this award and the significance/impact of his or her clinical contributions, the nominee's curriculum vitae, and a minimum of two letters of recommendation from other ACCP members. At least one of these letters must be from an individual outside the nominee's current institute of practice. Self-nominations are not permitted. Current members of the ACCP Board of Regents, ACCP Foundation Board of Trustees, PPI Board of Directors, ACCP Awards Committee, or ACCP staff are ineligible. Nomination deadline: February 15, 2019.

2019 ACCP Clinical Research Challenge Registration Available Online

Register by February 6, 2019



Critically evaluating and applying the primary literature is an essential skill for clinical pharmacists. Research and scholarship contributes to improved health outcomes for patients and advances in the profession of clinical pharmacy. This innovative and unique competition offers teams of three

pharmacy students the opportunity to participate in an online journal club and the chance to submit a clinical research proposal. Plan now to participate in 2019. Team Registration Deadline: February 6, 2019. Register now.

Eligibility

Participation in the ACCP Clinical Research Challenge is voluntary, and no entry fee is required. The competition is only open to pharmacy students pursuing their first professional pharmacy degree from an accredited institution, or one that has been granted candidate status, who are in the first 2 years of their first professional pharmacy degree program (P1 and P2 students for 4-year programs; P1 and P2 students for 3-year accelerated programs; and the first 2 professional years of 0-6 or 0-7 year programs). Only one team per institution can enter the competition. Institutions with branch campuses, distance satellites, or more than one interested team are encouraged to conduct a local competition. ACCP provides a written examination that institutions may use as a basis for their local competition, if they desire. This examination for 2019 is now available and may be requested by the ACCP faculty liaison or registering faculty member by e-mail. Format

All eligible teams in 2019 will have the opportunity to compete in round 1: Online Journal Club. Teams achieving the top 40 scores after round 1 will advance to round 2: Letter of Intent (LOI) Submission. In the event of a tie, the top 40 scores will be determined by the time it takes the teams to complete the online journal club exam.

Teams advancing to round 2 will be provided information regarding the research environment, which will include a specified budget and timeline in which the proposed research must be completed. Eligible teams will have 21/2 weeks to develop and submit an LOI online following the criteria outlined here.

Teams achieving the top 20 scores after the LOI round will advance to round 3: Research Protocol Design and be invited to submit a complete research proposal. Teams will be notified regarding their status to participate in round 3 by e-mail by March 25, 2019. Proposals are due by midnight (CST), April 19, 2019. Students are not required to be ACCP members to participate. Team registration should be submitted online and must be initiated by a current faculty member at the respective institution. Washington Report 2018 ACCP Government and Professional Affairs Advocacy Highlights

ACCP's Government and Professional Affairs team has been fully engaged and active throughout 2018 in Washington, D.C., and across the country, advancing

the integration of clinical pharmacists into team-based, patient-centered practice structures. Here are some highlights from the past 12 months.

- Kathy Pham, Pharm.D., BCPPS, Joins ACCP as Director, Policy and Professional Affairs: In January 2018, Kathy Pham, Pharm.D., BCPPS, joined the ACCP Washington, D.C., office as director of Policy and Professional Affairs. A pediatric pharmacist by training, Pham served as the NICU clinical specialist and pharmacy residency program director at Children's National Medical Center for 8 years. She now leads ACCP's engagement, collaboration, and communication with medical, pharmacy, other health professional societies, health quality organizations, and payers/purchasers to promote and help achieve medication optimization for individual patients and populations.
- HHS Secretary Alex Azar Responds to ACCP's Medication Management Questions: As the U.S. Senate considered the nomination of Alex Azar, a former drug industry executive, to serve as the secretary of the Department of Health & Human Services (HHS), Senator Tom Carper (D-DE) introduced questions on behalf of ACCP to Azar related to his positions on policy approaches to improving medication use among Medicare beneficiaries. In his responses, Azar stated his commitment to using the power of Medicare to drive transformation of the U.S. health care system from a procedure-based system that pays for sickness to a value-based system that pays for quality and outcomes and highlighted the importance of the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation (CMMI) in these efforts. Azar also stated that his priorities would include working to make health care more affordable, altering Medicare to reward providers for promoting good health, and tackling the opioid epidemic.
- ACCP Launches New Patient-Centered Team-Based Practice Forum: In conjunction with the

ACCP Updates in Therapeutics[®] 2018 meeting in Jacksonville, Florida, ACCP launched a new 3-day **Patient-Centered Team-Based Practice Forum**, including a series of interactive programs to help practitioners develop and/or enhance their clinical pharmacy services to deliver comprehensive medication management (CMM). The Forum also featured a keynote from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and provided access to some important first learnings from the CMM Effectiveness and Implementation Grant study. ACCP's International Activities

Strategic Direction 2.2 of the <u>2017 ACCP strategic plan</u> calls for the College to enhance the growth and evolution of the clinical pharmacy discipline worldwide. Toward that end, *Pharmacotherapy* and *JACCP* have engaged a diverse group of authors, reviewers, and editorial board members, including many who reside and work outside the United States. In addition, the College's other international efforts continue to expand. Currently, ACCP provides the following programs and services designed to support and facilitate the evolution of clinical pharmacy across the globe:

- Professional Development Programs. ACCP provides live professional development programs (usually 2–3 days in length) for pharmacists at international sites that address the following:
 - Clinical skills development
 - Teaching and precepting
 - Leadership and management
 - Research and scholarship
 - Pharmacotherapy applications to advance pharmacy practice
 - Pharmacotherapy (BCPS) board examination preparation
 - Other topics tailored to meet an organization's needs

- Clinical Services Development.
- Professional Degree Program Development. ACCP offers consultation and guidance on design of the clinical curriculum, learning outcomes assessment, experiential education, faculty development, and other subjects relevant to program development and enhancement.
- Organizational Strategic Planning.
- Recruitment of Qualified U.S. Clinical Faculty and Clinical Pharmacists for Full-time Positions outside the United States.
- Access to Pharm.D. Degree and Training Programs. ACCP coordinates consideration of highly qualified non-U.S. pharmacists for admission to select U.S. Pharm.D. programs and facilitates access to postgraduate training opportunities in U.S. residency and fellowship programs.

ACCP provides program evaluations and assessments, reports, strategic planning summaries and recommendations, curricular plans, and other documents as work products of the activities listed above.

In 2019, as part of a new organizational communications plan, the College will further highlight its current international activities and solicit applications from ACCP members to actively participate in specific programs and services. Look for more information in future issues of the ACCP Report.
